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## Chief Executive Officer, Emory Healthcare (7/1/2023)

Professor of Cardiology

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Joon Sup Lee, MD, joined Emory Healthcare as the Chief Executive Officer in July 2023. Dr. Lee joined Emory Healthcare after a 27-year career at University of Pittsburgh Medical Center (UPMC) as a clinician, clinical researcher, academic leader and physician executive. During this time, Dr. Lee's scope of responsibility continuously increased, culminating in his position as the executive vice president, UPMC, and president, UPMC Physician Services. He was responsible for more than 5,200 employed physicians, including all clinical faculty of University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine, and over 3,500 advanced practice providers. As a full-time faculty member, he served as the Vice Dean for Clinical Affairs at University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine. His scope included all aspects of care delivery, including quality of care, patient experience, patient access, clinical informatics, pharmacy service line and digital transformation.

An interventional cardiologist by training, Dr. Lee's research and clinical interests focused on the role of stem cells in the treatment of heart disease, rapid treatment of cardiac emergencies and catheter-based therapy for valvular heart disease, including Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement (TAVR). Dr. Lee served as chief of the Division of Cardiology and was the founding executive director of the UPMC Heart and Vascular Institute. From 2019 to 2021, he was the Chief Medical Officer of UPMC Insurance Services, a \$13 billion full-service health insurance division of UPMC.

Dr. Lee continues to practice medicine and is board certified in Cardiovascular Diseases by the American Board of Internal Medicine.
